

Displays and Exhibits Policy

As an educational and cultural institution, the Morton-James Public Library welcomes exhibits and displays of interest, information and enlightenment to the community. Displays of handiwork, historical material, nature study, or any other material deemed of general interest may be exhibited. As stated in the American Library Association's Bill of Rights the display and exhibit spaces shall be made "available on an equitable basis, regardless of the beliefs or affiliations of individuals or groups requesting their use."

The Library Director shall accept or reject materials offered for display based on its suitability and availability. Permitting the use of library display and exhibit areas does not constitute an endorsement by the Morton-James Public Library of policies or beliefs presented in the display or exhibit. The Library reserves the right to limit the content, size, number of items and the frequency with which the individual, group, or organization shall sponsor a display.

The Library assumes no responsibility for the preservation or protection, and no liability for possible damage or theft of any item displayed or exhibited. All items placed in the Library are there at the owner's risk.

The principle area of display is the Kimmel Gallery. Other open areas throughout the Library may be used for displays, if appropriate.
